# e. Hot Lunch Supplier – Le Bistro Presentation

- More vegetarian options were discussed
- Parents can order up to 3 days before, but meal plans are open for the year.

- Parents can cancel up to 7am the day of and could be given a credit (same policy for snow days)
- All ordering done online
- Can't guarantee for allergies but they don't use any nut products
- They have a subsidised rate for students with food needs

## f. After School Program Presentations and Approval

- Choir (7pm) Mr. Dimitri
  - Children are introduced to singing, dancing and acting
  - This year they are doing Hairspray
  - We are the only school that gets the service after school
  - o 2 semester program for \$120 in order to make it accessible to students
  - Want to open it grade 2 next year
  - Want to do High School Musical next year
  - o He will have the performance space booked prior to the program starting

Motion to approve the Choir program was put forth by Karen Der, seconded by Lorraine Bélanger and carried by members in attendance.

- Karate (7:45) Annie & Angelo
  - Typically 1 instructor per 30 students
  - 27 classes in the school year (9 classes in each session = 3 sessions)
  - \$95/session and has been steady for multiple years
  - Once a student reaches green belts they are permitted to attend extra lessons
  - At the elementary level there is no physical contact

Motion to approve the Karate program was put forth by April Luong, seconded by Stephanie Vezina-Tulli and carried by members in attendance.

- Chess (8:15)
  - Two groups junior during lunch and senior after school on Mondays
    - Possible to teach a mixed third class (26 students) on Monday afternoons from 3:35-4:35
  - Junior class 16 students and Senior 24 students
  - o Runs from mid-September to June
  - Additionally forms teams to take to tournaments to compete on behalf of the school
  - Will organise Chess in the Park in the summer

- He would like to maintain the compensation arrangement that he worked under this year
- Enfant Compagnie
  - 1 monitor to 20 students (25 students would be split into 2 classes)
  - o Run 3 sessions each year, fall, winter, and spring
  - Parents can register on paper or online
  - Everything it nut free but all food exceptionalities are accommodated
  - Discussed having more home fundamental classes offered in addition to babysitting courses
